

Many of you already know me or have briefly come in contact with me at a car show, but did you know that I grew up as a MOPAR girl? When I was born my Dad had a red 1948 Chrysler convertible with the Highlander interior. Over the years there was another Chrysler and several Plymouths and Dodges. There was a turquoise and black 1959 Dodge coupe and the 1964 white Plymouth Sport Fury with red and white bucket seats that I learned to drive on. In 1971 I needed a car for student teaching, Dad and I found a 1966 Dodge Coronet with bucket seats. I loved it! My soon to be husband, Frank, hated it! He just didn't seem to have the knack of starting it. At the age of 61, my Mom learned to drive the 1976 Dodge Charger my Dad had when he passed away. She drove it, but as a new driver was leery of how fast it could be. She had always liked the neighbor's Oldsmobile, but my Dad wouldn't go look at them. She decided she wanted a smaller car so went looking. After checking the Olds Omega we also checked a Pontiac showroom. We walked in and she fell for a 1980 Pontiac Phoenix coupe.
