# **REGRETS and REDEMPTION**

In 2006 I was watching one of those TV detective shows. In one of the scenes a character appeared entering a mansion's driveway in a really cool new vehicle by Pontiac called the Solstice!

Being the impulsive person that I am, I immediately went to my local Pontiac dealer the very next weekend and purchased a brand new 2006 red Solstice. Unfortunately, a year later I realized that no matter how cool the Solstice was, it was not the right car for me. A combination of my plus-size body, the lack of the vehicle's trunk space, and an engine that was not very powerful (it was not a GXP), I fell out of love with the Solstice. At the same time our beloved Pontiac announced a new, large four-door model that would replace the Bonneville which had ended after the 2005 model year. This new model was built from GM's Australian brand Holden. The Pontiac G8 was coming in model year 2008!

Two versions would be made, same car but powered differently--a 6-cylinder base version and the powerful GT version powered by the famous LS2. The GXP version was not yet available with its even more powerful LS3. With a personality that seeks instant gratification in all thing's car related, so I was not willing to wait for GXP; I felt the GT would be adequate to fill my need for the new model. I quickly went to my same local Pontiac dealer and purchased a new 2008 G8 GT with all available options with a red/onyx interior. I was very happy to trade the Solstice with only 4000 miles on the clock. I was very happy with the new G8 and kept it in my garage with no rain or winter driving. I owned the car for almost two years. That same local Pontiac dealership, with which I had a long relationship, called me in early 2010 to ask if I was interested in selling my G8. They had a customer who had totaled their G8 and wanted another at the very time GM was making the foolish decision to shut down Pontiac production. The dealership offered me the same price as I had paid for the car plus a small kicker to help me make my decision. I took the deal, and it immediately made me one of those guys you meet at car shows that tell you, "I should never have sold that car," which we have all experienced and lived those regrets.

Jump ahead to 2017 and I still was feeling those same regrets, so I too started to look to purchase another '08 or '09 G8 GT. I found many with high mileage, some that needed lots of work, and others that the seller was trying get American Picker style pricing. One early spring day, while searching one of many web sites, I came across a 2008 G8 GT with a very manageable 88,000 miles on the car. It was located at a Chevrolet dealer about 100 miles from my residence in Eastern Pennsylvania. The Pontiac was in very nice shape both inside and out. I called the dealer to check availability and immediately took off for Dover, Delaware to check out the '08. I test drove the car and was getting more excited with each button I pushed. The dealer's salesperson could see and feel my excitement, so when I asked him if he would accept a lower offer on the car, he just smiled and said, "No." He knew he had me, and I knew he had me, so I agreed to the price and purchased the car.

Later, after some research I found that I was the third owner and that the car had started its life as a Hertz rental car. It was then purchased by a man who lived in Northern Virginia who then traded it to this Delaware dealer for a 50th Anniversary Camaro after many years of ownership. The dealer also provided me with the name of owner number two. He was very willing to share information on the history and service records of the car that he had owned for 6+ years. So now I have owned the car for almost 6 years and, unlike the first G8 I owned, will not be parting with this one for quite some time.
