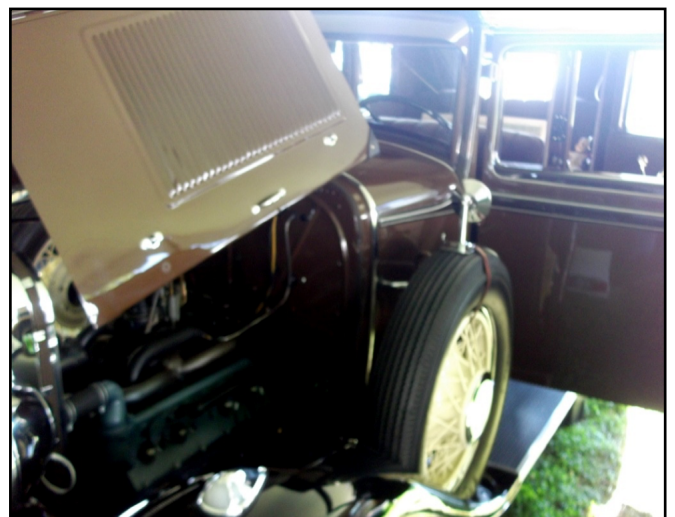
**DAS AWKSCHT FESCHT 2016**

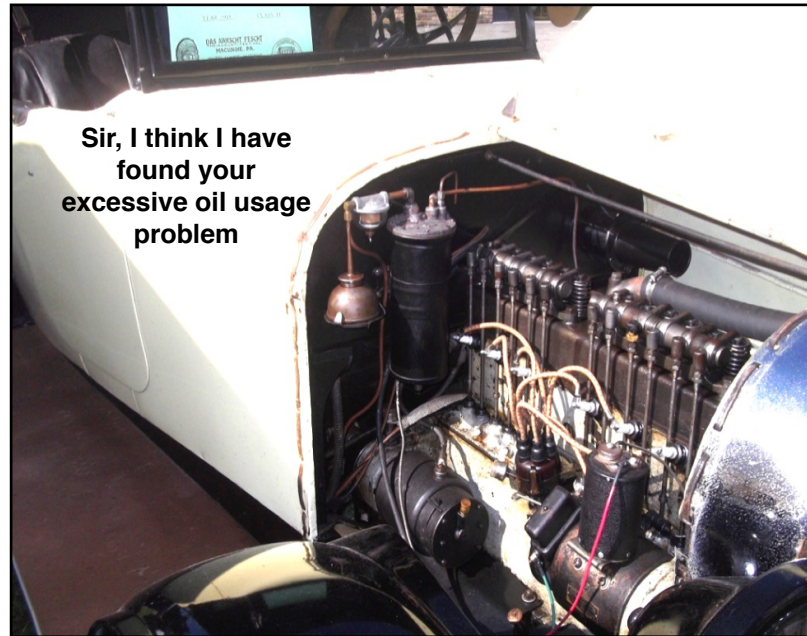



