I've lived in Macungie Pa with my family since 2005, relocated for work, previously lived in lower bucks county. Got started into cars in late teens. I had a few friends and class-mates that had pretty cool cars; camaro, firebird, mustang and I was driving a \$400 '73 montego; not too cool 2. So I started saving money, loved building and fixing things and was hoping to get my own cool car to work on and enjoy. Since I didn't know much about cars I asked a neighbor guy who was several years older and was always working on cars including his big block 69 chevelle if he new anyone selling anything. I got talking to him and he said he would help me locate a project car and help me do some work. \$750 later we brought home the 69 Firebird, 350HO, 4 speed, 10 bolt posi, parchment deluxe interior that I have had for the past 4 decades. It wasn't much at the time; had lots of rust, ripped up interior, rod knock, but at least it was drivable. He drove it home for me since at that time I couldn't even drive a manual trans. 2.

Several years later saved enough money and a guy recommended a body shop in Langhorne he said did good paint, so I took it there and they were willing to do the body. I put it back in the garage/s [a couple different house moves] where it sat, except for the occasional semi annual startup, for a large number of years. Life got in the way; college, marriage, kids. Worked with a couple local sources to get some work done, got it inspected and finally realized my dream after all these years. It still isn't quite done as I am trying to get the interior completed; having a heck of time trying to find someone experienced with those old style headliners, but we take it out every couple weeks for a nice drive reliving my childhood dream. Hope to bring it to the GM show in Macungie this year and looking forward to spending time with others at POCI talking Pontiac shop and sharing memories.
