



Relentless cold rain on October 14 failed to dampen the spirits of 21 hardy Keystone State Chapter members who spent an enjoyable day touring several auto related venues in the town of Hershey, Pennsylvania.




Our day began promptly at 9:00 am when the doors opened to the beautiful 3 story Antique Automobile Club of America museum located on a hill

overlooking Hershey. Currently celebrating its

20th anniversary, this facility houses a rotating display of about 130 antique automobiles, two dozen busses, assorted

auto related exhibits including a

machine shop, and diner. One gallery is





dedicated to the world's largest collection of Tucker automobiles and related material. Arranged by decade in diorama backdrops the cars offer an enjoyable viewing experience for enthusiasts as well as the general public. We were treated to a special tour hosted by museum board member Hank Hallowell who provided

special insight on many vehicles as well as access to areas not open to the public like storage areas for cars not currently on display

We took a quick break for lunch at Primante Bros sports bar, known since the 1930s for signature sandwiches piled high with french fries and cole slaw along with a variety of meat and cheese.


Our next stop was the new AACA library and research center located in an extensively renovated office building that also houses the AACA



headquarters staff. An open two story foyer with a dozen vehicles on display provides a dramatic entrance to a secure facility housing 3 million pieces of literature - many rare and valuable - related to the history of the automobile. On arrival we were greeted by Steve Moskowitz, AACA

Executive Director and the individual responsible for the

design of this facility. Also on hand to coordinate our visit was Don Barlup, a charter member of the Keystone State Chapter who



has served POCI and AACA in many leadership positions over many years. Thanks to these

individuals we were offered the rare opportunity to see secure storage areas that are off limits to the public.

To conclude a very full day Hank Hallowell took us through two buildings where he stores some of his



car collections. One, identified as the "Pontiac Building" served as a Model T and later an Oakland dealership. This eclectic assortment included two Pontiacs - a

### 2023 JUNK YARD TOUR FRIDAY NOVEMBER 24th



Winfield Salvage would be our yard tour this year. A little bit of a drive, but a shade closer, time wise, than Dave Rapps in Starlight.

The address is 860 Wolf Hollow Rd. Big Cove Tannery, Pa. 17212 BONUS, 2 (two) yards are here next to each other. Satellite view shows mostly the "other" yard. Winfield's is largely under trees. He has stuff from back to the 40's. W.W. Salvage is the other yard, and he has a newer selection. For our members that have any mobility problems, this will be a challenge. I'm sure a "yard car" will be able to give you the tour. It's fairly hilly, some pretty steep.

The road into the yards does not dead end, it's a through road which will give us a challenge for parking. **Meet Steve** at the fuel/store at the exit for McConnellsburg, Rt. 522. At the exit when you come to Rt. 522 you can look to the right and see the store. There is ample parking. We should try to carpool from there for the guys that really aren't going to purchase anything. The fuel station, store is on the left of Rt. 522 going north. I'll be there by 8 AM or earlier.

Also, there are 2 salvage where we are going. We are going to the one on the LEFT side of Wolf Hollow Rd. Anyone wanting to tour the other yard may do so after we have seen Winfield's.
