Performance Years Show - Saturday June 16, 2012

For the second year in a row, Performance Years Pontiac and Pypes Performance Exhaust sponsored its open house and, on Saturday, its combined All Pontiac, Mustang and hot rod show at its headquarters in Lansdale, Pennsylvania. The weather was perfect - sunny, crystal blue sky and temperatures in the mid-70's to low 80's. Having missed the show last year, I did not know what to expect and it was a wonderful surprise. I considered the show was a big success with a reported car count was 427. Frankly it looked bigger to me.

The Pontiac field had the largest showing of cars. If you love GTOs, you can't miss this show next year. While probably 75% were of the Pontiacs were GTOs, there was a nice showing of full-sized cars, hot rods and racing Pontiacs.

The Mustang field held a wonderful array of cars from Ford Motor Company and there was also a quite large and diverse field of hot rods available to see. Interestingly, many of the hot rods in that field were actually full-blown drag racing machines and clearly ready for the track.

Entertainment was in the form of a disk jockey followed by two, live, back-to-back bands. As usual, the sound system was cranked up way too far for me! The audio guys had trouble getting the second band up and running and they didn't start until well after 3:00 PM. This meant that awards did not get started until 4:30 and by then, many of the cars and drivers had left for home. This issue should be addressed to the sponsors for next year's event. Concessions were available for lunch which did a brisk business most of the day.

The two cars I wanted to take home were a set (yes, two of them) of 1961 Bonneville convertibles. Both were frame up restorations. One white and one blue with a white top. For the George Heim trophy, I had to pick the blue one. It was a bit sharper with the blue paint, had correct bias ply tires with correct period/size white walls but it was a tough call - so many beautiful cars, not just these '61's.

The winner of the trophy was Martin Hirsch who has homes in New Jersey and New York. The car, a 1961 Bonneville convertible in bright blue and white top and leather interior. It had a high performance 389 V8 and was fitted with a manual four speed transmission and floor mounted shifter - all very rare. In addition the car had a''QQ'' tag (historic plate) with the plate number reading ''KOOL61''. Obviously, he got extra points for that. For those of you who missed the show, you should make plans for next year. If the weather is anything like it was for this year's show, it will be even bigger and better next year.
