

#### Do You Have the Need for Speed? Try Electric.

Our youngest generation of mechanical engineers is turning away from conventional internal combustion engine equipped cars and paving the way for a new era of electric powered ones. A wonderful example of this is a program is at the University of Pennsylvania (Penn). The program, a relatively long-standing one, had little interest and support in previous academic years. Titled "Penn Electric Racing," it is a student-run Formula Society of Automotive Engineers (FSAE) electric team. In 2015, during his junior year, my nephew Aedhan and a number of his colleagues in mechanical engineering breathed new life into the program. In that year, their entry race car, called REV1, won seven of eight categories to take first place for electric vehicles in the world-wide FSAE competition in Lincoln, Nebraska. Hundreds of teams from colleges and universities compete against each other in this annual event.

For the 2016 competition, the team built on the previous year's success, but set out to make major improvements in their entry, REV2. The team's goals for 2016 were threefold: (1) add front and rear aerodynamic wings to increase lateral cornering ability, (2) redesign unsprung assemblies for 10" rims and 18" tires, and (3) decrease vehicle weight from 415 lbs. to 399 lbs. or less.

Major components of the REV2 race car included:

- Tube space frame weighing 59.5 lbs. was chosen over a monocoque to assure torsional stiffness
- Aerospace-grade aluminum suspension components
- 10" x 7" Keizer aluminum rims with 18.0x6.0-10 LC0 Hoosier tires chosen for lower operating temperatures, high max lateral force and lighter weight
- Shock absorbers designed to deal with race track conditions at the Lincoln Airpark
- An Enstroj Emrax 207 medium voltage water-cooled electric motor
- A stock Drexler FS LSD mechanical differential
- Floating steel brake rotors front and rear with Ferodo Sintergrip ST pads in front and AP Racing Carbon Lorraine Sintered pads in the rear
- A battery pack was purchased from Electric Power & is the large-format lithium polymer pouch cell design
- The entire body was fabricated in a shop in Phoenixville, PA and made of ultra-light carbon fiber

Weighing in at 379 lbs., the REV2 is capable of 0 to 60 MPH in 2.4 seconds. This is faster than the Tesla Model S P90D "ludicrous" mode or a McLaren P1. The team returned to the 2016 FSAE competition, winning first place in 4 of 8 categories and second place overall. The REV2 also broke the all-time US FSAE record in acceleration, making it the fastest student-built race care in the country.
